MINISTER'S LETTER

Moving Stories is the focus that the London District of the Methodist Church has chosen for itself for the next two years. The hope in doing so is that people in churches across London will engage with those in their communities (inside and beyond the church) and listen to stories that they have of migration -



stories about people moving that are also moving stories in an emotional sense. Having heard these stories, the task of the church will then be to find creative ways of telling them. Our desire in all of this is to attempt to counter the negative messages that the media all too often communicates about migration/immigration issues. If you have such a story and would be prepared to share it, or are aware of a friend or neighbour who has and might be - please let me know.

It is against this backdrop of Moving Stories that we will approach Christmas this year - and this seems fitting. If ever there was a moving story in both senses it is the story of Christmas - an emotional rollercoaster, in which we find a number of people on the move.

There are the magi following a star, believing that it will lead them to the birth of someone who will change the world (and here comes a shameless plug - please buy a ticket to come to see the highly acclaimed Journey of the Magi by Springs Dance Company at Christ Church with St Philip, Worcester Park on 15th December).

There are the shepherds, following the directions of the angels, longing for the birth of a child that will, in time, transform their country and their lives.

There are Mary and Joseph - two people preparing for the birth of their child, having to go on a long journey at the behest of other, more powerful people.


And, of course, there is Jesus - taking his place in this world - and carried by fearful parents on a perilous journey to seek asylum in a foreign land, his life under threat from day one.

These are all moving stories that contribute to a bigger moving story.

In the Christmas story there is also an invitation to us as readers, to move ourselves to a place where we can listen and be changed by what we hear and discover. Part of this journey will undoubtedly be an emotional one, but it can be a physical one too.

Which is why it is good for us all to come together to make this journey and hear this story year after year after year - that we might hear something fresh within it, that it might touch us in a new way, as individuals and as a church community. Once again then please join us in Advent, at Christmas, Epiphany and beyond. And as we embark on this journey, let us each be open to the possibility of being moved by the story we encounter.

The RCCG is one of seven churches that were slated for demolition in Jigawa, and all the churches have been told they will have to relocate. Please pray the congregations will be compensated and given a good location.

Father God, we pray as one for the persecuted Church, knowing that we are all brothers and sisters in Christ, united by your love for us into one worldwide family. 
CHRISTMAS POST BOX AND CARDS

Our Father's Love Letter

Last month Arigon Sinani played a video at Martin Way during the service which featured a Letter from God. As requested by many, the words are now reproduced below, but if you wish to watch the video itself, it can be found at https://youtu.be/ZsBhvSMQUk4

My Child,

You may not know me, but I know everything about you (Ps 139:1). I know when you sit down and when you rise up (Ps 139:2). I am familiar with all your ways (Ps 139:3)—even the very hairs on your head are numbered (Matt 10:29–31).

You were made in my image (Gen 1:27). In me you live and move and have your being, for you are my offspring (Acts 17:28). I knew you even before you were conceived (Jer 1:4–5). I chose you when I planned creation (Eph 1:11–12). You were not a mistake, for all your days are written in my book (Ps 139:15–16). I determined the exact time of your birth and where you would live (Acts 17:26). You are fearfully and wonderfully made (Ps 139:14). I knit you together in your mother's womb (Ps 139:13), and brought you forth on the day you were born (Ps 71:6).

I have been misrepresented by those who don't know me (John 8:41–44). I am not distant and angry, but am the complete expression of love (1 John 4:16). And it is my desire to lavish my love on you (1 John 3:1), simply because you are my child and I am your Father (1 John 3:1). I offer you more than your earthly father ever could (Matt 7:11), for I am the perfect Father (Matt 5:48). Every good gift that you receive comes from my hand (James 1:17), for I am your provider and I meet all your needs (Matt 6:31–33).

My plan for your future has always been filled with hope (Jer 29:11), because I love you with an everlasting love (Jer 31:3). My thoughts toward you are as countless as the sand on the seashore (Ps 139:17–18), and I rejoice over you with singing (Zeph 3:17). I will never stop doing good to you

(Jer 32:40), for you are my treasured possession (Ex 19:5).

I desire to establish you with all my heart and all my soul (Jer 32:41), and I want to show you great and marvellous things (Jer 33:3). If you seek me with all your heart, you will find me (Deut 4:29); delight in me and I will give you the desires of your heart (Ps 37:4), for it is I who gave you those desires (Phil 2:13).

I am able to do more for you than you could possibly imagine (Eph 3:20), for I am your greatest encourager (2 Thess 2:16–17). I am also the Father who comforts you in all your troubles (2 Cor 1:3–4). When you are broken hearted, I am close to you (Ps 34:18); as a shepherd carries a lamb, I have carried you close to my heart (Isa 40:11). One day I will wipe away every tear from your eyes, and I will take away all the pain you have suffered on this earth (Rev 21:3–4).

I am your Father, and I love you even as I love my son, Jesus (John 17:23). In him, my love for you is revealed (John 17:26). He is the exact representation of my being (Heb 1:3). He came to demonstrate that I am for you, not against you (Rom 8:31), and to tell you that I am not counting your sins against you (2 Cor 5:18–19). Jesus died so that you and I could be reconciled (2 Cor 5:18–19). His death was the ultimate expression of my love for you (1 John 4:10): I gave up everything I loved that I might gain your love (Rom 8:31–32).

If you receive the gift of my son, Jesus, you receive me (1 John 2:23), and nothing will ever separate you from my love again (Rom 8:38–39). Come home and I'll throw the biggest party heaven has ever seen (Luke 15:7). I have always been Father and will always be Father (Eph 3:14–15). My question is: will you be my child (John 1:12–13)? I am waiting for you (Luke 15:11–32).

Unforgettable moments of our Holiday in Norfolk

(part two)

Our second Sunday we again went to Dareham church, this time to share their Café Worship in their hall with drinks and biscuits. Afterwards a group of ladies, who have an arrangement at a nearby carvery where they get an adults portion for a child's price, invited us to join them, a regular Sunday treat. Chatting over the meal we discovered amazingly that one lady was born in Harleston (Norfolk) and went to school with Mary's cousin who now lives in Shropshire. A very small world!! We then spent another afternoon with Rosemary and her daughter followed by sad farewells.

Monday was another trip down memory lane. About 3 to 4 years ago I was given a telephone number of a Michael Grey. In November 1954 we met at the Police Training School, he was from Gloucester, me from South Wales. I telephoned Michael to find out that he lived near Bury St Edmonds. Our police lives saw him go to East London and me to West London. We did meet occasionally with our wives but, like lots of friendships, these meetings became fewer and fewer, the last time we saw each other was about 45 years ago. He and his wife, Vivian, drove over to us for lunch and then for afternoon tea. Even after all those years we still recognised each other and caught up with all the happenings since that first meeting in 1954.



For our stay we only had two damp mornings, so we weren't kept in at all. Besides our local Dareham there are some other interesting market towns of yesteryear. A great favourite was Holt which had a pretty number of small streets full of good quality shops, yummy eateries and full of visitors.

From our base we were only about 30 to 40 minutes away from the coast, obviously the North Sea. Another favourite was Wells-next-the-Sea with



its harbour, historic buildings, many interesting shops and modern colourful eateries.

What is quite frightening there is the sea defences, a grass bank going on for miles about 20 to 30 feet high and a steel barrage on rails that when shut prevents the storm waves going further along the village main street. In its harbour was

an old two-masted schooner, the 'Albatross', about 120 feet long. It is now a floating restaurant, with Dutch omelettes and pancakes being their specialties. We very gingerly climbed the very steep metal gangway to enjoy their food. Afterwards we were helped back down the now steeper gangway due to the incoming tide.



Blakeney, another pretty coastal village, but the tide was too low for us to take a boat trip to see its resident seal population. Sherringham is another very popular seaside town that has the North Norfolk Railway, also known as the "Poppy Line" running into it from Holt.



Sherringhams coast line is perched on 30 to 40 foot rocky cliffs. Here again some coastal buildings have their windows and doors sandbagged up as protection against the North Sea storms. Local folk told us Sherringham frontage now gets battered more often – all very frightening.

This time of year the low fen-like sea front was full of 'twitchers' going in and out of the massive reed beds. All were dressed in camouflage and carrying tripods with either massive lensed cameras or binoculars, some did look rather strange!

It's all a very different coastline to what we've been used to in the Scottish Western Isles, but the lack of protection against the force of the sea must be a constant worry. What with our trips out, people watching, enjoying the sunshine with hardly any serious gales this holiday trip for us was a treat. Meeting folk and generally doing just what we wanted to do.

One day though, our river viewing saw a horrible fight between a family of swans, the male protecting the female and signets from the intruder, thankfully after lots of feathers flying the intruder paddled upstream. Our Egret we viewed daily, it was fantastic watching a Cormorant swimming under water chasing fish. There was always something to be seen, the pair of Kingfishers being the highlight.

The river otters were also in the area, but being night time hunters we never saw them, nor the fallow or Munkjac deer which also frequent the area. Other residents were three types of bats in the Mill roof, but our attempts to see them also failed. Our local field were full of sheep and they would graze their way from left to right each day.

As I said our apartment was great. As we were leaving hundreds of geese started their migrations, with their 'V' formations, honking day and night – a sure sign that winter is coming!

On our journey back we stopped to picnic in the sunshine at the perimeter fence of Lakenheath (RAF) Air force base watching the ground movements of mainly American fighter planes but one did fly around before landing. It brought back memories of family days out with our boys plane watching, especially the 'Air shows'.




Advent for Everyone: A Journey With the Apostles by Tom Wright
