MINISTER'S LETTER

The summer is drawing to a close and autumn is rapidly approaching. The long days that I had so looked forward to for months are now behind us. The same thing happens every year, of course – seasons coming and going is part and parcel of life on this planet (however blurred the boundaries between them might now be) – but this year, with



our eldest daughter about to head off to university for the first time, I am perhaps even more aware that time is passing. It honestly doesn't seem that long ago that we brought our firstborn home from the hospital and Rebecca and I embarked upon the great adventure that is parenthood. It feels like time is passing at an ever-quickening pace.

One of the things that I was looking forward to this summer were three Bruce Springsteen concerts that I was fortunate to have tickets for. Those concerts are also now behind me and, as much as I thoroughly enjoyed them all, I am, in some ways, back to square one. Bruce will be 74 this month and I'm again wondering how many more opportunities I will get to see him with the E Street Band. And perhaps I'm not alone in this. In his choice of songs on this tour (which has now seen him return to play shows in the US), Bruce himself seems to be addressing the subject of his own mortality.

In the middle of his set is "Last Man Standing", which acknowledges that he's now the last surviving member of his first band. Introducing this song to his audience, he says: "[Mortality] brings a clarity of thought and a purpose that you might have not previously experienced. At 15, it's all tomorrows. At 73, it's a lot of goodbyes. That's why you have to make the most of right now."

None of us ever knows how long our lives will be or how many days we have left. We do know from personal experience that some lives are cut painfully short. Age isn't everything. That said, the older we get, the more we do tend to reflect upon our own mortality.

I fully appreciate that there are people within our church community who are significantly older than Mr Springsteen is, who might look at me and think that I'm a mere whippersnapper. I understand that but, even being 20 years younger than Bruce, I'm still realistic enough to know that it's highly likely that there are now many more days behind me than there are ahead. And that's a sobering thought. Life is rushing by far too quickly for my liking.

But what this says to me is that we need to acknowledge our mortality more. We need to talk about aging and death more, not less, in no small part that we might make the most of the precious gift of life and the time that we do have left. To use the language of Moses (and George Michael!), we need to "choose life". In choosing life, we change the conversation from the length of our days to the quality of them - and that, as much as anything, is about a state of mind.

As seasons change, and as leaves start to turn a different colour and begin to fall to the ground, let us make the most of the imagery that autumn offers us to engage in conversations about the cycle of our own lives. Let us reflect upon the God-given opportunities that this incredible gift of life still holds before us, that we might better understand how to seize them. And, speaking of opportunities, may we hold before God in prayer all those children and young people embarking upon a new stage in their journey, that they might feel supported and loved, whatever those next steps might look like or involve.
